

A structured learning programme for parents, carers and supporters in Liverpool who wish to gain knowledge and skills about their child's neurodevelopmental condition, with strategies to support the difficulties that may present around:

- Neurodevelopmental conditions/learning difficulties and associated mental health difficulties
- Autism Spectrum Disorder/Condition (ASD/C)
- Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD)
- Sensory Processing/Integration Difficulties (SPD)
- Challenging behaviours associated with ND conditions

Free Professionals Awareness Raising Training

This commissioned training has been developed to provide an awareness and understanding of the day-to-day challenges of living with neurodevelopmental conditions (NDCs) and the surrounding issues for staff working to support children, young people and families to enable them to:

- Understand the difference and similarities between ADHD, ASD/C , and other NDCs.
- Recognise the typical behaviours of ADHD, ASD/C, and other NDCs.
- Recognise the impact that unsupported and unmanaged characteristics of NDCs can have on an individual and their family.
- Understand the impact that sensory processing difficulties have on children and young people.
- Recognise local support available for professionals, young people and families who have children with NDCs.

Young People aged 12-14 and 15-19

Designed for those living with neurodevelopmental conditions to help them gain a better understanding of themselves, explore their own needs, learn new skills and build confidence as well as develop friendships. Groups meet up for learning and social activities, they're led by young people who take an active part in the design, decision making and development of their group, encouraging activities participation and ownership.

Places are limited and designed for those most isolated, who do not attend other youth provision.

- Staying safe
- Planning and preparation for trips
